


2011 Year in Review


Library Cardholders

13,630 Brookfield residents are active Library card users. That is 73% of Brookfield's Population.

2011 was another banner year for the Brookfield Public Library. Circulation in 2011 was just under 300,000 items and has increased by nearly 95% since 2005 even though the population has remained relatively static. Over 148,000 people visited the Library in 2011, an increase of 17.7% over 2010 and a 55% increase from 2005 when the Library had 95,852 visitors. 15.3 items were checked out per capita in 2011.

From 2005 to 2011, the number of programs increased by 541% for adults and 169% for children and teens while program attendance increased by 233% and 57%, respectively. Computer use increased 221% over the same time period, from 11,849 sessions in 2005 to 38,008 sessions in 2011.

Statistics show that the Library continues to be a vibrant hub of activity where people come to be inspired and informed. The Library serves many roles to residents of all ages. For children, the Library is a homework center; a social gathering spot, and an entertainment complex. Weekly storytimes, movies, and activities help them to learn and grow. The Library's computer classes, workshops, lectures and clubs provide adults with activities that educate and entertain. Computers, laptops and eReaders provide access to the Internet, online resources, digital downloads and to computer software such as Microsoft Word and Excel. Area organizations and community groups hold meetings at the Library.

We look forward to bringing new and exciting opportunities to residents in 2012. Thank you for supporting the Library and its mission.



New office terms start at the June meeting.

The FOL election process is governed by our Bylaws which can be found on the *Friends* page of the Library website. Each March, a nominating committee appointed by the FOL President prepares a slate of candidates for the April meeting. Additional nominations can be made from the floor at that meeting. Once the slate is approved, the Secretary in collaboration with the Director of Membership makes the Slate available to all current paid members.

Every other year the elections are for two of the officers and any vacancies in the directorships. This year we will be electing a President and Secretary. Currently there are no vacancies in the Directors' positions.

FOL 2011 Achievements

2011 proved to be another active year for Friends members. There were significant accomplishments in three areas: Fundraising, Community Outreach and Administrative tasks.

The Taste of Brookfield as our major fund raising event continues to grow in its success, raising over \$10,000 in 2011. Special book sales and ongoing book sales in the Book Nook prove to provide a steady source of income throughout the year. These funds help support many special projects at the Library such as the "Born to Read" program.

Friends Community Outreach contributions included the Brookfield Farmer's Market, the Brookfield Beautification Commission Community Art Program and the Holiday Event Trolley.

Administratively, the Friends have updated their Bylaws to reflect membership fee changes and developed an FOL brochure available in the Library Foyer and at the Check Out Desk.
